She became president shortly after the fire in 1996 and led us through two rounds of grants to restore the house. In 2012 she became treasurer, providing a firm grip on our fundraising and finances as well as guidance for the organization and genealogy support for members. She will be sorely missed.

George Adams Wyman Motorcycle Across America 1903

Dave Wyman is a member of the Lee County Historical and Genealogical Society in Dixon, IL. He advised me his city finally erected a plaque commemorating George's achievement of being the first to ride a motorized vehicle across the US.

George left San Francisco on May 16, 1903 on his California motorized bicycle. It had a 200CC, 1.5 hp motor and 28" tires on wooden rims. He traversed mountains, prairies and the industrial heartland on unpaved roads and trails and often along railroad tracks. He suffered numerous breakdowns along the way and made many improvised repairs. The trip took 52 days, arriving in New York City on July 6.

The George A Wyman Memorial Project, Inc. has

erected 160 waypoint signs to mark his route across America. Dave sent me a poster showing the route and locations of the waypoints. It will be displayed at the Francis Wyman House along with a photo of the plaque and the full story for FWA members and visitors.

The cab ride through the farmland with hedge rows close on each side brought us back in time. We could imagine farmers in the olden days on their carts. Visits to Westmill begin and end at the Sword in Hand Pub and B&B. It's right next to the St. Mary of the Virgin Church.

People have worshipped here for at least a thousand years. The belltower houses the 15th century baptismal font which is still used today.
